The designation allows the Fitness to Practise Department to more accurately monitor case progression and distinguish between cases that can be expeditiously progressed and those cases which cannot be progressed because any progression is dependent on a third-party investigation.


# **Education**

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#### **Education Department – Overview**

- **Approvals:** We completed 59 approval visits in the last FY. This is a 16% reduction on the budget forecast, but in line with post SW department head count.
- Review of education quality assurance: Post ETC, the department has worked with visitors, education providers and internal staff around a new quality assurance model. Proposals are also being put forward for the systems infrastructure required to support pilot activity. This work remains on track to make recommendations to the ETC in June.
- COVID-19 working with education providers: Guidance issued in March has been very well received within the sector and provided the needed flexibility education providers need during this time. Engagement with stakeholders has been elevated since March to support temporary registration for students. Work currently focused on ensuring extra capacity provided is being used effectively, and in such a way where possible that protects students in practice and supports progression towards programme completion.
- <u>SET 1 for paramedics</u>: ETC agreed a position statement in light of COVID-19. This provides scope for us to support the health service on a case by case basis where their planning to meet the SET 1 degree threshold for entry in September 2021 has been impacted. We will take home country approach to understanding impacts and what might be needed to support workforce needs, including extending last entry cut-off dates below degree level where reasonable to do so.



#### Overview of approval visits April 2018 - March 2020


Overview of approval visits

#### Overview of workload, Number of active cases, April 2018 - March 2020



#### Registration: overview

- This section provides an update about the work of the Registration Department for March 2020. All of the department's service standards were consistently achieved for the period with the exception of answering calls and emails.
- A total of 7,276 UK telephone calls were received which is 2,024 (or 21.8%) less than compared to the same period in 2018. The closure of the office due to the COVID-19 crisis attributed to fewer calls being received in the month of March. The team answered 82% of UK telephone calls and the shortage of fully trained Registration Advisors attributed to this service standard not being met as well as actively prioritising available resource to fulfil the department's regulatory functions of registering new applicants, renewing registration and managing continuing professional development audits.
- A total of 6,817 UK emails were received which is 3,365 (or 97.5%) more than the same period in 2018. The closure of the office due to the COVID-19 crisis attributed to the increase in emails being received. All emails were answered within an average of 5 working days. The shortage of fully trained Registration Advisors attributed to this service standard not being met as well as actively prioritising processing paper processes to ensure these were up to date in anticipation of the team working remotely.
- A total of 361 international applications were registered which is 56 (or 18.4%) more than compared to the same period last year. For the period of March 2020 the key performance indicator was met.
- The department registered 579 UK applications which is 142 (or 19.7%) fewer compared to the same period last year. All UK applications were processed within 3 working days.

#### COVID-19

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic the Registration Department undertook the following actions:

- Ensured all registration employees were equipped to begin working from home on 23 March, with the exception of two employees who did not have broadband capability. All team members are now able to work from home.
- Cancelled the CPD audits for physiotherapists, arts therapists, dietitians, chiropodists and hearing aid dispensers and arranged appropriate communication with the professions and our partners.




